The library will unveil Sirsi Unicorn to the public on August 4th. The new system is tailored with YOU in mind. It gives users greater freedom by allowing them to access and maintain their own library accounts. The new features will allow library card holders to:

- Access My Account to:
  - Review My Account: Lets you see items you have checked out, lets you renew items in your checkout list, makes you aware of bills (fees & fines) you may have accrued, & gives you a list of items you placed on hold, your position in the holds queue, and if the item is available for you to pickup!
  - Make a <u>User PIN Change</u>
  - Renew My Materials (excludes items on hold -- the system automatically lets you know if the renewal was successful!)
  - Change My Address

The new system also offers users other exciting features:

- Book cover graphics, summaries, table of contents, reviews, excerpts, publisher description, & author biographies
- The ability to place your own holds
- Recommend items for the library to order
- Create customized readers' advisory lists
- Make reading lists that can be printed out or emailed to you







SCA members were also available to answer question -- of which there were many!


Overall, it was a fun-filled, family-friendly day -- just what you've come to expect from a library sponsored event!

Carry Me Home / Sandra Kring: 1940. Rural Wisconsin. Sixteen-year-old Earl "Earwig" Gunderman is not like other boys his age. Fiercely protected by his older brother, Earwig sees his town and the world around him through the prism of his own unique understanding. He sees his mother's sadness and his father's growing solitude. He sees his brother, Jimmy, falling in love with the most beautiful girl in town. And while Earwig is unable to make change for customers at his family's store, he is singularly well suited to understand what other cannot: that life as they know it is about to change;

the coming war will touch them all." For Jimmy will enlist in the military. And Earwig will watch his parents' marriage buckle under the strain of a family secret. Their family and town irrevocably altered, Earwig and Jimmy fight to find their own places in a world changed forever.



**Nancy Drew Notebooks --** This series is for young readers and follows Nancy at age 8. Consists of 69 titles.

**Nancy Drew: Girl Detective --** Consists of 15 titles as of 1/06. Published by Simon & Schuster, these books feature a Nancy of the 21st -century with enhanced & expanded storylines.
