Ms. Noland is an advocate for people with disabilities, having written and spoken extensively on the topic in the Cleveland area. She is also accomplished in American Sign Language.

She has been active in the Ohio Library Council, the American Library Association, and the Society for the Deaf.

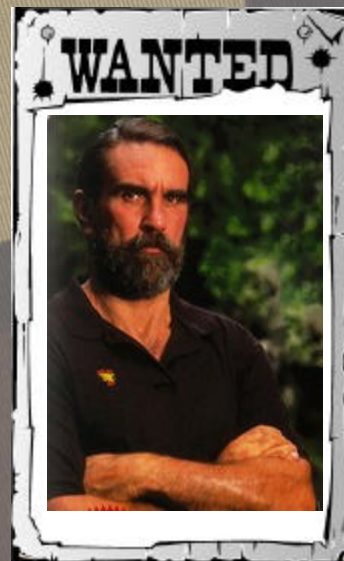
Richard Marcinko: Real American Hero

Experience: 30-years in a variety of specialties such as counter terrorism, intelligence, and Special Operations

Military: Enlisted in U.S. Navy in 1958. Served two tours in Viet Nam as a Navy SEAL, working his way up in rank of Captain. Member of the Underwater Demolition Teams. Served as Naval Attaché to Cambodia. He earned 34 citations and medals including the *Legion of Merit*, *Silver Star*, *Bronze Star with Combat V* (4 times), *Navy Commendation Medal* (2 times), *Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Silver Star*.
