Wild About Eyes Kiosk Display at PCDL Branches



ver the next several months, three PCDL branches will take turns hosting *Wild About Eyes* Kiosk, a FREE interactive display that teaches children and adults the importance of good eye health and safety.

The kiosk consists of four learning stations that use bowling balls, handheld paddles, and an eye safety matching game to provide hands-on learning.

Wild About Eyes was developed by Prevent Blindness Ohio and the Boonshoft Museum of Discovery in Dayton. It is funded by the Ohio Department of Heath, Bureau of Child and Family Health Services, and the Save Our Sight Program.




RETRO TV ON DVD







Beach-worthy: What makes a book beach-worthy? Follow these


simple quidelines:

- 1. You should be able to hold the book with one hand (so you can hold a treat in the other!) No hefty tomes on this beach! Sorry Harry Potter! Sorry War and
- 2. The storyline has to be exciting and interesting, but not "lofty" too much thinking could cause sunstroke - maybe even a heat rash!
- 3. The book must be one you will enjoy, not something you feel pressured to read by a list. Who cares if you prefer Nora Roberts to Barbara Kingsolver, or Nicholas Sparks to John Grisham. It's your time! Spend it reading what you like!
- "Fluffy Fiction" and "Beach Book" don't have to be synonymous! There are plenty of titles out there that contain the perfect balance between 'weighty' and 'fluffy' - such as: The Thirteenth Tale by Diane Setterfield, a fascinating Gothic -style ghost story that pays tribute to Brontë and du Maurier; *The Lace Makers* of Glenmara by Heather Barbieri in which a young American woman helps a group of lace makers change their lives—and, ultimately, her own, set against the backdrop of an idyllic Gaelic village; or **Sunnyside Blues** by Mary Carter which gives readers the satisfying tale of twenty-five-year-old Andes Lane who must "...confront the secrets she tried to leave behind and the lies that have kept her running..."

Other Beach Book Suggestions:

- Hothouse Flower and the Nine Plants of Desire / Margot Berwin: In the heart of New York City, hidden in the back room of an old Laundromat, are nine rare and valuable plants. [This book] tells the story of this legendary garden, and the distance one woman must travel—from the cold, harsh streets of Manhattan to the lush jungles of the Yucatan Peninsula—to claim what is hers. Getting great buzz in reviews!
- **Summer House / Nancy Thayer:** Charlotte is 30, rebelling against her family's goals for her life, and privately atoning for a terrible mistake she made. Helen, 60, has overheard a conversation that brings her agony—and a chance to understand her place in the family. And Nona, at 90, knows the time has come to reveal the most profound secret of all.
