As you are all aware, the library has a levy going on the ballot this November (Issue 8). I just want you to know how the 25% reduction to our budget has played out this last year.

Most of you know that we have reduced our hours of operation. We have also had to drastically reduce our book and DVD purchases. Recently our catalog server collapsed forcing us to purchase a new one. This meant that we could not purchase new materials in August.

Our Young Adult Program (after school Tweens and Teens) has been seriously reduced. This means very little programming for these energetic people after-school. Thankfully, our Library Friends are supporting all our Children's Programming.

Our Reference Databases have been drastically reduced for those of you who want scholarly information.


Our plans to create a toy lending library, a home-schooling collection, and to extend our home-bound services have all been put on the back burner indefinitely.

23 at 2PM to visit with readers, and talk about and auto-

graph her books. She will be joined by local authors Janet Sims and Steven Shiverdecker!

Tara writes: "I have a new series coming out this fall, The Chapman Files, that is four books, being released back-to-back from September -December. The books are set in a fictitious town that is fashioned after Eaton. Preble County is called Fort County in the books — named after the Fort!

The series centers around an expert witness psychologist, Kelly Chapman. Each book is one of her cases. Kelly lives in a fictional town, Chandler, Ohio, but Chandler is just another name for Eaton. 

Operation USS Preble Receives Community Plaque

Many counties can claim sister cities, but not very many can actually claim an active duty sister ship! Both Preble County and the USS Preble, DDG-88 has the distinct honor of being named after an American Revolutionary War hero, Commodore Edward Alexander Preble. When Commander John F. G. Wade, the previous Commanding Officer of the USS Preble, DDG-88, learned that the ship's name was also shared by a small rural county in Ohio, he instantly wanted to establish a connection between the ship and Preble County. Answering the call of friendship, Roy Kouts, Chair of the project, launched Operation USS Preble.

A commemorative plaque was transferred to the Navy on September 18 as part of Opening Ceremonies to the 2010 Pork Festival. The special ceremony was held in the grandstand area of the Preble County Fairgrounds directly after the Pork Festival Parade. The crowd expressed their appreciation during this momentous occasion as our county honored the proud men and women who serve on the ship that shares our name. In a letter of appreciation, CDR Joseph Cahill wrote: Director Noland and Citizens of Preble County: We're honored and humbled by your support! The plaque is wonderful, and I'm thrilled to see the photos of it. The bond that we have formed through our shared namesake is truly incredible. We're proud to share the great "PREBLE" name with you.
